Mr. Ekram, a Deputy Secretary to the Government of Bangladesh, is currently on study leave to pursue a PhD in Information Technology at Monash University, Australia, within the Department of Software Systems and Cybersecurity. His research focuses on developing a structured framework for assessing cyber harm and systematically analyzing cyber risk.

With 17 years of experience in government service, Mr. Ekram has played a pivotal role in shaping Bangladesh's cybersecurity infrastructure. His contributions span key positions in the National Cyber Security Agency, the a2i project, and the Ministry of ICT. He has led major e-government initiatives, including mygov.bd, grs.gov.bd, and the National Portal Framework, strengthening Bangladesh's digital governance.

He holds a BSc in Mechanical Engineering from BUET and an MS in Materials Science and Engineering from the University of Alabama, USA.

This lecture offers students a unique opportunity to engage with an expert at the intersection of cybersecurity and national security policy.
