Dhaka University Vice-Chancellor Professor Dr. Niaz Ahmed Khan said that students should remember that our strength is not in driving on the wrong side of the road, showing off or fighting. Our strength lies in taking everyone with us.

"We want to walk together in unity, hand in hand with everyone in the society, including farmers, workers, schools, colleges, madrasas, temples, public and private universities."

He said these things in his speech as the chief guest while inaugurating the program titled "July: Beyond Seeing, Not Seeing" at the Department of Sociology, Dhaka University yesterday, to celebrate the first anniversary of the historic July Uprising.

The programs included seminars, memoirs, essay competitions, discussion meetings, exhibitions and cultural per-



formances, etc.

In the seminar chaired by Acting Chairperson of the Department of Sociology, Professor Fatema Regina Iqbal, Professor Salma Akhter and Professor Dr. Samina Latifa of the department presented papers.
