Minutes & Resolution of the Fees Revision Committee Meeting

A meeting of the Fees Revision Committee was held at the Meeting Room of the VC Office on April 22, 2025. Chaired by Prof. Mamun Ahmed, Pro Vice Chancellor (Academic), the meeting was attended by the following members:

Agenda:

1. Comprehensive revision of the fee structure
2. Accommodation for international students at the Sir P. J. Hartog International Hall, University of Dhaka.

Discussion & Recommendations:

After detailed deliberations, the following resolutions and recommendations are submitted for consideration by the University Authority and the Academic Council.

1. The Committee unanimously agreed that the existing fee structure—USD 1,200 for non-SAARC and USD 500 for SAARC students—no longer reflects the services, academic standards, and infrastructural facilities that the University aspires to offer. The revised fees aim to bring Dhaka University at par with peer institutions within our global ranking cohorts. A transparent, service-aligned, credit-based fee system has been proposed to ensure accountability, better resource allocation, and competitiveness in attracting international students.
2. The additional revenue generated from the revised fees will be directed towards:
 - a) Targeted marketing campaigns to enhance international student recruitment.
 - b) Strengthening Dhaka University's visibility in global rankings through improved mobility metrics.
 - c) Enhancing academic and non-academic services offered to international students.
3. The Committee recommends a robust need-based and merit-based waiver system, prioritizing:
 - a) Students from SAARC countries (up to 80% waiver).

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
- b) Applicants from LDCs, the Global South, women, and marginalized groups (up to 50% waiver).
 - c) A formal scholarship policy document will be drafted to ensure transparency and equitable access.
 - d) The Vice Chancellor/International Student Admission committee may be given discretionary power to relax scholarship/ waiver limit in the proposed policy.
4. The Sir P. J. Hartog International Hostel will be dedicated exclusively to international students. Funds from accommodation fees will be utilized to upgrade hostel facilities, ensuring modern amenities such as air-conditioned rooms, high-speed internet, common areas, and enhanced security—aligning with international standards.
 5. The University will deduct a standard overhead charge from the collected fees to cover administrative costs. The remaining funds will be equitably distributed to:
 - a) Teaching Departments for academic development and faculty incentives.
 - b) Research Centers to promote international research collaboration.
 - c) International Hall to support ongoing maintenance and student welfare programs.
 - d) Office of International Affairs for its operational expenses.
 - e) This model will encourage departments and centers to actively engage in promoting internationalization.
 6. The proposed structure is designed to align DU's operations with global higher education standards, ensuring:
 - a) Improved student services (visa assistance, orientation, language support).
 - b) Enhanced reputation in attracting agency-facilitated admissions through partners like ACU.
 7. a) Upon approval by the Academic Council, the revised fee structure will be effective from the date of relevant Syndicate.
 b) A periodic review (every two years) is recommended to adjust fees in response to market dynamics and service enhancements.


The Committee strongly believes that these measures will not only ensure financial sustainability but also significantly contribute to Dhaka University's strategic goal of becoming a preferred destination for international students.


The Committee respectfully submits these recommendations for approval by the University Authority and the Academic Council.

Student from the Global South: Up to 50% tuition waiver (merit or need-based).

Once approved, the Syndicate will form a committee to determine the scholarship policy. However, waivers are applicable only for tuition fees, and will not cover accommodation, application, or thesis fees.

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
